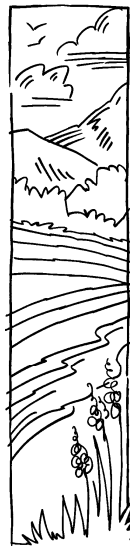

Life Tree Café Opening Soon

Hi St. Paul Family and Friends,

I'm Ryan, you usually see me with the choir, or with the 7th & 8th graders, but today I've got something else to share, something truly exciting, something that I hope and pray will touch each and every one of you. It is called **LIFE TREE CAFÉ**. In the past few years, we as a congregation began an effort to re-energize our local mission. Not that we don't do lots of wonderful things for the community; and I won't list them here for save some space; but I'm sure you know what they are. We've wanted to do more, to not only provide physical

food, but spiritual food as well. We brought in Pastor Brian to help in this effort and have a number of activities in the works, maybe the biggest of these activities is a mission outreach program called **LIFE TREE CAFÉ**. I'd like to share with you some information about **LIFE TREE CAFÉ**, what **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** is all about; how **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** can touch the community; how **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** can benefit this congregation, and how **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** can help you grow in Christ.

So what is **LIFE TREE CAFÉ**? **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** is a topic based, discussion forum; open to the community. As the name implies it has its basis in a café setting, a comfortable place where people can feel safe to participate. It is a place where people can share their ideas, their stories and their faith. The

discussion topics can be simple and fun or they can about the core issues of today. The topics and discussion agenda are provided **LIFE Tree Café** organization and led by the **HOST**. The discussions are for the most part a time to share and build relationships, to get to know each other better. The premise being, that as relationships are built and trust is gained, then others can really know who you are and what you believe in and what we at St. Paul are all about.

So who is **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** intended for? Who is needed to make



LIFE TREE CAFÉ work? The answer is simple. **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** is for everyone and everyone in some way or another is needed to make this work.

The easiest way to help, and in a way the most important way to help, is to be what is called a **SEED**, (a participant) someone from the congregation that attends the one or more sessions and shares who they are, their story. Even if it is a complete stranger drawn to the session by the topic, or simply there to see what **LIFE TREE CAFÉ** is all about.

In the coming weeks there will be a table on the patio with more information and I hope a video so you can see how very simple this really is. There are some other roles such as **HOSTS** and **FRIENDSHIP TEAM MEMBERS**. And yes, we will need a few individuals to

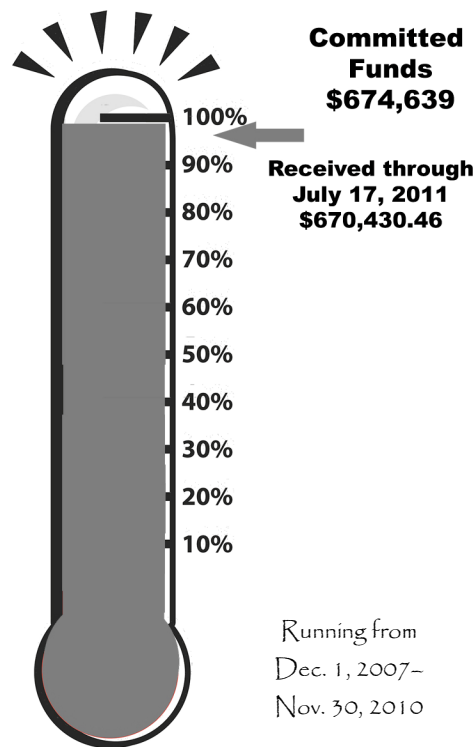
LIFE TREE CAFÉ is a great and exciting way to connect to the community, but it has another wonderful side effect. It will give us an opportunity to increase our connection with each other.

Letters from the Front—Treats for Troops

Thank you very much for the thoughtfulness of you and your compatriots in putting together the boxes of goodies for us. I briefly became the most popular person at work because there were enough goods to go around for everyone with lots left over. The snacks went quickest, and we have been slowly drawing down on the toiletry items since their arrival. It is incredibly thoughtful and generous of you to offer your support.

I am safely ensconced in the middle of a decent sized base. We have our own security for our small camp. There are snow covered mountains off in the distance and the air is clean. Not a bad place to be. Definitely a different experience than last time when I was out in the middle of nowhere. Not sure if word ever made it back to you through Kayla or Katie but your packages then were part of the lifeline that kept me alive. As it is, I am working about 14 hours a day, which leaves enough time to work out, eat, and go to sleep. At least it keeps me out of trouble. I haven't been keeping up with the news to know how things are being reported, but the bad guys are getting crushed, which makes the separation from family worthwhile.

Please see below an email from Jason Kaplan, with the 3/2 Marines in Afghanistan: His lengthy email is interesting and lets us know a little what it is like in Afghanistan:

I apologize for the lack of e mails, but let me tell you a little story. We have to live off of generator power since there is no power lines around this country. We had a small generator and it did not give off enough power to run this FOB (forward operating base), so we requested and received a new one. It's roughly twice as big. GREAT you say, not so much.

What we didn't do was request an electrician to help us hook it up. Needless to say when we got it all hooked up and threw the switch we blew every power thing that was attached to the generator. And as you know we don't

have a Lowe's where we can go buy our new things. Fortunately, after a week able to replace what we broke.

I was excited to hear about the drink mix packets that will be awesome. I don't like to drink water so much right now and that's not a good thing as it was 122 degrees yesterday. It was easily that hot again today. It's been a tough couple of days on the men, we have to continue to patrol and when they get back we don't have AC living spaces so they have to find shade. We'll make due but its going to take us a while to get used to it.

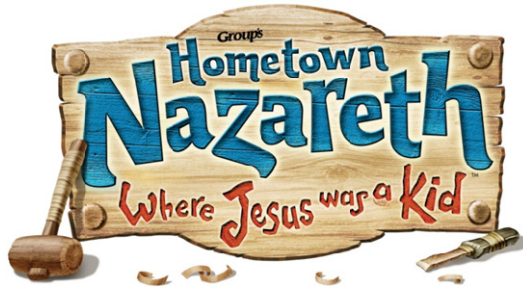

Stephen Ministry Update

Stephen Ministers are well trained, caring lay people giving distinctively Christian care-giving to others in a confidential relationship. Stephen Ministers do not take the place of pastors but walk alongside pastors in extending care in a long term, intentional and personal way. Stephen Ministers, meeting one-to-one (men with men and women with women) each week listen, reflect, support and encourage



people going through difficult times for as long as they are needed. Stephen Ministers share scripture, pray with and for the care receiver, and give freely of themselves as they are called to do. If you (or someone you know) are going through a difficult time and feel the need for someone caring and faith-filled to walk alongside, there are Stephen Ministers waiting to serve. Please contact Pastor Judi.

Financial Peace University

FPU comes to St. Paul! What is FPU? FPU is a 13 session course that informs people how to handle money using biblical principles as a guide. Topics include saving, credit, budgeting, mortgages and much—much more. Who should consider this class? Just about anyone, from the novice to the expert. Feel you have no money skills? Commit to the course. Need a refresher? Commit

to the course. Just or recently married? Commit

to this course. Single and/or recent college grad? Commit to this course.

This course has room for up to 12 households, single or married, old or young to participate. Each session is 2 hours in length and involves DVD presentation, small group conversation (not prying—people working together towards a common goal), and hands on suggestions that you can begin to work

on immediately. The average family who completes the 13 sessions pays off \$5300 in debt and save \$2700. Singles are empowered to handle their money with confidence and find accountability partners to help. Financial stress is reduced in the home as couples learn how to communicate about money and work together toward family goals.

Sessions will meet on Sundays—

some in the morning and some in the evening. We

will begin in September. There is a cost to the course (\$125 p/household) that will cover all materials and a lifetime membership in FPU that allows you to attend any course as many times as you want, for life.
