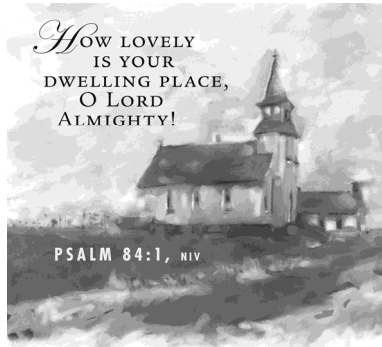

## A word about LifeTree Café from Pastor Tom.....

It was late December 2010 when I was doing a little search looking for potential ideas that seemed to be a bit different from traditional ones when it comes to church programming. That was when I came across the LifeTree Café concept. I shared the idea at our January 2011 council meeting and then in February, Lisa Young from Group Publishing was in our area and came to the council meeting to talk about Lifetree and its concept. The Congregation Council was excited. It was different. It was faith based. It provided opportunity to talk about daily life matters and issues. With the council on board, we ventured off to launch the program.

Fall of 2011 was launch time. A number of people within the St. Paul Community have made the commitment to help see this program happen. From hosts to friendship team members too many others are working to offer a program that provides a safe place to gather and share. Each session is one hour long and refreshments are provided.

So who is LifeTree Café for? It is for you! LifeTree participants are people just like you. There is no particular audience other than everyday people who want to engage in community and conversation. I want to invite and encourage you to attend a LifeTree Café session. Think of it as a conversation café. A place where you can do a lot of listening and join in some conversation in small group if you so choose.

LifeTree Café meets on Monday's at the City Grill in Brea, NW corner of Brea Blvd and Imperial Hwy (Brea Gateway Center—next to Corner Bakery). On Tuesday's we meet on the campus of St. Paul Lutheran Church. The topic is the same on both nights in the same week. We begin promptly at 7pm and end promptly at 8pm. Come check out the newest conversation in town and bring a friend!

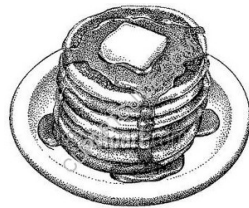

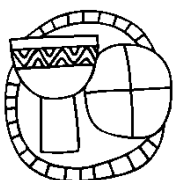

## February—the Month of Love

Well, the Valentines are now on display in all the stores. The candy conversation hearts are on the shelves and all the boxed candy have red hearts and ribbon all over the packaging.

We think of Valentine’s Day as a chance to tell someone how much we care about them. But, why is it we only tell them on a special day? Every day should be a special day. I know that many people end their phone calls with “I love you.” But, after a while that becomes trite (to my mind) and is the same as saying “have a good day.” But, then on the other hand it is better to end your call with “I love you” than nothing at all.

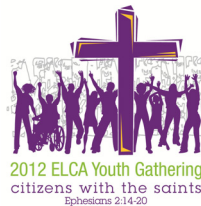

Led by Stephen Leaders Pastor Judi Miller and Kathy Peters, this training consists of 50 contact hours of class time—held on Monday nights at the church—plus outside readings and writings. A second Stephen Ministry training class begins in mid-February

**Souper Bowl of Caring**

**HELP US FILL THE “POT!!!”**

Again this year, on Super Bowl Sunday, February 5, our youth are collecting for the SouperBowl of Caring – a nationwide effort of young people that brings in millions of dollars of worth of food staples for hungry people all across America. In 2011 teams collected **\$9,605,368.08** in cash and food items for **10,173 Charities** – which is: \$5,220,227.08 plus 2,739,247 food items or 1,645,894 lbs. of food!!!
