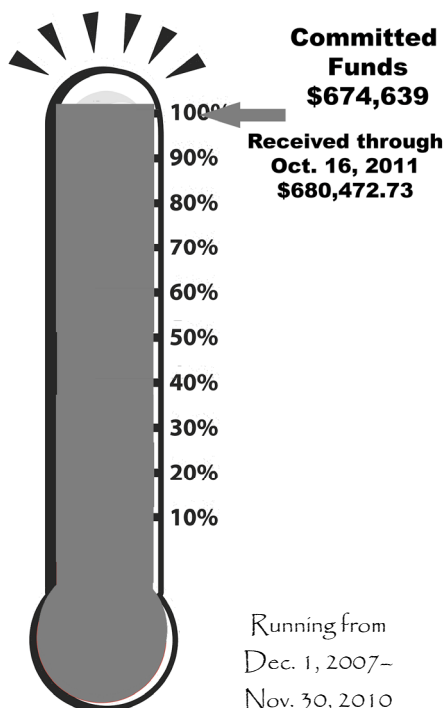

Sisters in Christ,

I am so excited this morning after looking at the front page of the paper (10/8/11). Laymah Gbowee has won the Nobel Peace Prize!!!!

Why is that particularly important to me? She was the Keynote speaker at the WELCA Triennial Meeting in Spokane this summer. Ardis and I had the pleasure of hearing her speak.

She is a Lutheran woman, a woman of faith, a woman of spirit and of ACTION! She acknowledges how helpful the health kits, sewing kits, prayers and fasting are to all in need. BUT,

Her message was powerful and I can not do it justice so I urge you to click on

For a well spent 30 minutes you will be rejuvenated and enlightened. The Holy Spirit will be talking to you. How are we going to respond?

Yes, how are we going to respond? I know we all have very busy lives, much more than the woman of a generation ago. BUT, it has always been the women who have made social and sometimes political changes. Why? Probably, because they are the most interested in the every day life that we live and particularly the lives of our children. We want our children to live in a world with food, freedom, lack of

fear and health.

Leymah talks about how the woman of Liberia were sick and tired of being raped; their boys being kidnapped, given a gun and taught how to shoot someone. The women and their children were forced to live in terror every-day. They decided to do something about it. They felt they had nothing to loose. They wanted to reclaim their families, their lives and their country. The thing is they didn't do it with guns. As she says, sometimes you have to “kick them in the butt”.

The woman's vote came about because women were not afraid to protest and even go to jail. They had to bring attention to the inequity of franchise. They were tired of being patted on the head and being told “now, now, don't bother your pretty head”.

The pioneer women always were the ones that set up the schools and the social events and attempted to keep the new towns that sprung up across the west a safe and livable place for their children. They were the ones that brought morality to their group.

There are story after story about the bravery of women who put their lives in jeopardy for the betterment of their families and homes.

God gives energy and courage to women who wish to bring about a change for the good.

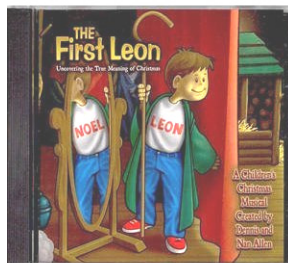

## *Jesus is the Reason for the Season!*

### *Sunday, November 27 at 5:00 p.m.*

#### *What is Advent?*

The word “advent” means “coming.” Christians know and celebrate the season of Advent as a time of preparation and reflection in anticipation of Christmas - the coming of the Christ Child into the world. The liturgical color for Advent is blue or purple.



the light becoming brighter and stronger over the four weeks of the season. Traditionally, purple candles are used for the first, second and fourth Sundays in Advent to represent Royalty and Repentance. A pink candle is used on the third

Sunday to symbolize joy (one tradition) or the mother of Jesus (another). In recent times the color of all the candles has been changed to blue - the color for hope. The additional large (and often decorated) white candle in the center of the wreath is called the “Christ candle.” It is lighted on Christmas Day and represents Jesus’ birth bringing pure light into the world.

#### *When is the Advent Season?*

The dates and number of days in Advent change from year to year, but Advent always begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and continues through Christmas Eve. This year the four Sundays of Advent are November 27, December 4th, December 11th, and December 18<sup>th</sup>. Advent has the most days it can!

#### *What is the Advent Wreath?*

An Advent wreath is a practical tool used to focus our hearts on the meaning of the season - celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. The circular shape represents God’s unending love for all humanity. Evergreens symbolize the hope of eternal life and growth that God’s people share. The four candles represent the Sundays until Christmas Day -

#### *What other items can be used to help celebrate Advent?*

The Jesse Tree, Advent Calendars, scripture cards, ornaments – there are literally dozens of ways to help your family count down the days to Christmas morning with an eye to the true meaning of the season! Come for a simple dinner and a time of family crafts and activities – make a wreath, a banner or other item to take home and use to get your advent off to a faithful start!!!

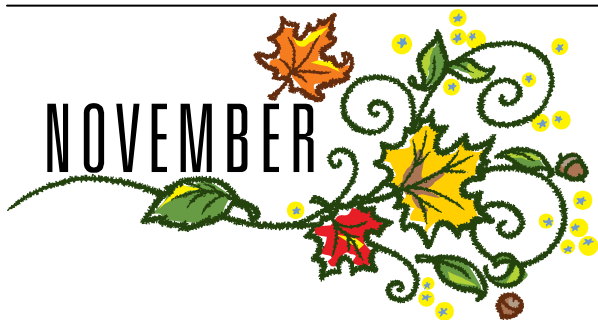
