December pays tribute to tradition and faith. Beautiful melodies transport to a snowy Ukraine, a German village church, Middle East rhythms and back home.

January’s concert features a composition many have heard, but usually only the snippet leading into the program! It is the bumper music from Jim Svejda’s program on KUSC. It is a stunning composition with modern rhythm AND beautiful melodies! Yes, it can be combined!

We approached February’s concert with a different rhythm. Karen Hansen sings real-life poetic meanderings with a slight nod to surface Hollywood romance. The violin, viola and cello create musical pictures from Romanian drama, Viennese fantasy and American folklore.

March is a contrast of musical language that includes Dvorak’s sumptuous Piano Quintet and Philip Glass String Quartet #5. The Glass Fifth String Quartet begins with a pluck and a shimmering leap and a trademark arpeggio into a sweet bell-like announcement. In the second movement, a syncopated, swaying, barcarolle-like melody in shifting meters alternates with the plucked and bowed chords of the introduction,

unified by a rocking bass pattern. In the scherzo-like third movement, a continually evolving dance-like figure initially alternates with a more regular, propulsive rhythmic passage, but gradually the two come together to form a transition to the rapturous, long melodic lines of the next, slow movement. A quicker middle section to that movement prepares for the soaring scales of the fifth movement, into which the quartet’s introductory material gradually returns, the two merging into a transcendent weightless resolution. Now you must come to hear this to see if it lives up to the description!

The Academy of Performing Arts at St. Paul continues to offer ways to learn new language to continue our creative process. Think of who could benefit from learning a new instrument or continuing vocal training. I continue to learn from our amazing vocal coach. By hearing new rhythms, melodies, harmonies and words I am compelled to pay attention. I allow myself to live in a world where I don’t have all the answers but with infinite opportunities for meaning, understanding, and connection to authentic experiences.

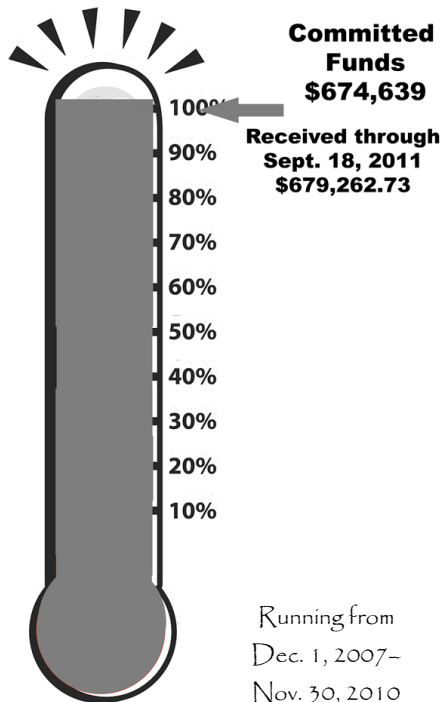
